Bryndzove halusky – potato dumplings with sheep cheese and roasted bacon.

Bryndzove pirohy – sheep cheese dumplings

Zemiakove placky – potato pancakes with flour and garlic fried in oil

Vyprazany syr – Fried cheese

Lokse – potato pancake

Trdelnik – Chimney cake (some might argue it is Hungarian or Czech but it is actually Hungarian, Czech and Slovak at the same time because of our past)

Cesnacka – Garlic soup (try it – it is not that garlicky)

Parene buchty – steamed dumplings filled with jam, sweetened poppy seeds, cheese or chocolate

Sisky – fried dumplings with marmalade and sugar

Sulance – delicious potato dumplings bathed in poppy seeds

Orechovnik – sweet walnut roll
